










Image of Infill & Adaptive Reused Design




Guidelines of heritage city conservation - the Charter of Indonesian Heritage Cities Conservation 2013:

- The Heritage City encourages partnership between the local government, communities, universities, and private sectors. as well as lesson learnt from many different cities.
- A Heritage City is compulsary to have a heritage city management plan:
 - vision, mission, strategy, program, implementation, monitoring and evaluation mechanisms.
- The Heritage City Management Plan = strong, hollistic, systematical and comperhensive management of a heritage city


OUTSTANDING VALUES

Heritage city is a city or regency poses extra-ordinary treasures in the forms of natural and sustainable cultural artefacs, buildings and its open spaces, including their physical, economical, and socio-cultural aspects. In context to the UNESCO World Heritage List, the heritage city should have one or more criteria of UNESCO Outstanding Universal Value.







crossed border municipality & regencies -2015-2030






MAPPING OF OUTSTANDING VALUES OF YOGYAKARTA Local – national - global level of values
