On 30 September 2009, in a session in Abu Dhabi, Batik Indonesia was declared by UNESCO as Masterpieces of Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity. As a form of gratitude and to encourage the conservation and development of national batik, the Government of the Republic of Indonesia, through Presidential Decree no. 33 of 2009, designated October 2nd as the National Batik Day. On October 18, 2014, in Donyang City, Zhejiang Province, China, Yogyakarta was designated as World Batik City by the World Craft Council.
